Addyson Sherbeck - Smart Like Einstein Champion Green Rider




Candice Runge - Chex Your Step Reserve Champion Rookie 2

Roger Tegtmeier 1947-2020

Long time CPRHA member Roger Tegtmeier passed away Monday, July, 20th, 2020. Roger passed away unexpectedly after spending his last day doing things he most enjoyed: riding horses, working with his coon hunting dogs and getting his favorite dinner of chicken pot pie.

Roger was one of the original founding CPRHA members. As a lifetime horse enthusiast, Roger instantly fell in love with the sport of reining after watching NRHA Hall of Fame Member, Bob Loomis compete at the Nebraska State Fair in the 1970s. From that moment on he pursued reining at every opportunity. Roger frequently visited Loomis's training facility in Lincoln, NE and then later Bee, NE trying to learn all he could.

Roger spent many years working with trainer Don Malcom of Lincoln, NE. In the late 80s early 90s Nick Johnson, a young trainer had just moved back home to Madison, NE. Johnson had spent the previous few years working with NRHA Hall of Fame trainers Bob Loomis and Bill Horn. Johnson had strong ties to CPRHA as well with his mother, Lavonne Kruid, being one of CPRHA's founding members. With this new excitement around the sport of reining in Nebraska, Roger had to be part of it.

In February of 1990 Roger went in search of a Futurity prospect to enter into the first reining futurity offered at the Nebraska Silver Classic. He settled on a green broke three year old mare from local AQHA Breeder Gary Clow. The mare was by Gary's AQHA Champion Sire Mr. Jaguar. Roger put Miss Jo Jaguar in training with Johnson in March of 1990 where he spent the spring and summer trying to get her caught up to his other two futurity horses. That fall Miss Jo Jaguar made her debut at the Nebraska Silver Classic and had a successful showing placing 4th and earning a significant pay check of over \$1,000 which was the largest prize Roger had ever won with one of his horses.

In 1991 CPRHA had officially organized and joined as an NRHA affiliate with 3 other NRHA affiliates to create a circuit of shows. Each club put on one show to create The Heart of America Reining Circuit. The Affiliates involved in the circuit were CPRHA, KRHA (Kansas Reining Horse Association), MRHA (Missouri Reining Horse Association) and SWMRHA (Southwest Missouri Reining Horse Association). The first show was held in May of 1991 in Columbus, NE, the second was in June in Carthage, MO, the third was held in July at Columbia, MO and the final show was held in Topeka, KS in August. To fully participate in this new organization, Roger had purchased a second horse from Nick Johnson, Jae Bar Nisa, who as one of Nick's other Futurity horses. He hired Nick Johnson show Jae Bar Nisa in the Open competition and he showed her in the Rookie class. Miss Jo Jaguar was shown in the youth class by Roger's son Sherman Tegtmeier. It was a successful season for the new reining family as Jae Bar Nisa became the Heart Of America Open Year End Champion, Miss Jo Jaguar became the Youth Year End Champion.

This first season with CPRHA completely hooked the Tegtmeier family on the sport of reining. Roger was an active member of CPRHA and seldom missed a show. The family became very involved as wife Julie Tegtmeier soon after started helping in the show office and son Sherman Tegtmeier went on to become one of CPRHA's board members and club trainers.

Throughout the 20 years of experience with CPRHA, Roger had many reining horses that he showed and enjoyed. Rogers favorite horses were these first two as well as the last two horses he enjoyed competing with Sante Fe Whiz and Breakout Wrangler.






WHAT YOUTH EXHIBITORS NEED TO KNOW BEFORE THEY SHOW

- •If you are showing in Youth or Youth Rookie classes, you must have a Youth membership card. Any youth18 years of age or younger as of January 1st may become a Youth member of the NRHA.
- •Youth members are not automatically considered Non Pro. If a Youth plans to show in Non Pro or Rookie classes, they are required to complete and sign a Non Pro application. Non Pro status is not required if you are showing in Youth or Youth Rookie classes only.
- •All horses entered in NRHA approved competition are required to have a competition license. Gelded status must be indicated on the competition license for entry into Youth classes. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to notify the NRHA Office of Gelding status.
- •All horses shown in Youth competition must be solely owned by one of the following (a) the youth, (b) a member of his/her immediate family, or (c) a corporation, partnership or other business entity provided the Youth and/or a member or members of his/her immediate family are the sole and only owners of that business entity. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to complete a relationship form to be filed at the NRHA Office.

The Founding and Early Years of the Central Plains Reining Horse Association

The Central Plains Reining Horse Association (CPRHA) was founded twice.


In its first incarnation, CPRHA can trace its roots back to the 1970s and the formation of the Reining Horse Association of Nebraska (RHAN).

RHAN was devoted to reigning horses for several years. Then the group's name was changed to the Performance Horse Association of Nebraska and it began to promote performance horses as well. The association folded after a few years.

Around 1980, a group of Nebraska reining horse enthusiasts gathered in Fremont, Nebraska for a reining clinic. This would lead to the revival of the CPRHA.

"During the lunch break, an organizational meeting was held to form what was to become the Central Plains Reining Horse Association," said Ron Petersen, who was one of the original members of RHAN and CPRHA. CPRHA was born – or back again – depending on how you look at it. The second incarnation of CPRHA was formed for the same reason




RHAN was – because its early members like Petersen "felt the time was right for a dedicated organization serving reining horse enthusiasts in Nebraska."

Though the timing was right, that didn't mean things were easy for the young association.

"There were. predictably, many challenges during those early years," Petersen said, "But the two most challenging were probably raising the funds necessary to add classes to our **National Reining** Horse Associationapproved shows and finding suitable facilities to hold our shows."


To fund many of its activities. Petersen said the early CPRHA held a reining clinic "with some of the most prominent, respected reining trainers in the industry." Those trainers included Bill Horn. Tim McQuay, Craig Johnson, Doug Millholland and Bob Loomis, among others.

To deal with their lack of funds for facilities, early CPRHA leaders


avoid the tree in the middle of the arena at the same location of a lead change!"

But early CPRHA leaders took these problems in stride, and they did the same with the challenge of growing membership. Petersen said they focused on two things during those early years - providing a fun environment for people to show reiners and cre-




ating a non-intimidating environment for newcomers.

"I don't think anyone on any of the early boards ever specifically gave a thought to growth," Petersen said. "I think we all just felt that if we successfully did those two things. growth would logically follow, and it did."



Though the CPRHA has since grown, many of Petersen's fondest memories of the association are of simpler times.

During the early days of the CPRHA, the association would hold monthly winter reinings in Fremont. It was often only 10 degrees outside and ten horses were considered a huge class. But, all the same, Petersen remembers these events with affection, especially the dinners participants would share at the Pancake House afterwards.



"Those little weekend reinings and the friendships and camaraderie that developed, especially at the after-reining meals, are some of my fondest memories of the early CPRHA," he said.

main difference between the CPRHA of those days and today is "unquestionably the quality and talent of our horses." "We showed some nice horses in those early days," Petersen said. "But it was nothing like the talent available now."



Championship Year End Awards will be given in the following classes: Short Stirrup Youth 10 and Under, Youth 13 and Under, Youth 14-18, Green Rider, Green Horse, Ladies, Men, Novice Horse 1, Novice Horse 1 Non-Pro, Open, Non-Pro, Limited NonPro, Prime Time Non-Pro, Rookie 1, Rookie 2 and Prime Time Rookie.
- 2. Owner and Rider must be a member of CPRHA before points count toward Year End Awards.
- 3. Points will be awarded based on total # of horses in the class ie 24 horses in the class. 1st place is awarded 24 points. Horses with a 0 score will be awarded a 0 but will get credit for showing in the class. Points are accumulated on a one-horse one-rider basis (just as NRHA awards Affiliate Points). Tie breaker: 1. Number of times class was entered. 2.Individual with the highest placings (number of firsts, highest scores, etc.)
- 4. Horses and Riders must show in the class in which they are attempting to qualify for a CPRHA Year End Award in over ½ of the circuit shows.
- 5. The Green Rider, Green Horse, Ladies and Mens classes are not NRHA approved classes. Riders do not have to be NRHA members and the horse does not need to have a competition license. Riders starting the pattern one handed must run the entire pattern one handed. Riders starting the pattern two handed must run the entire pattern two handed. Either way is acceptable. To be eligible for the Green Rider class, the entrant must not have won a reining class at the start of the year except in local 4-H competition or local open shows. Also, the rider must not have won over \$100 in reining competition. Green Horses must not have won a reining class at the start of the year or won over \$100 in reining competition. Before entering in a Green Horse or Green Rider class, each exhibitor will be expected to complete a Green Rider and/or Green Horse Declaration Form This form can be completed when registering and will only need to be filled out once a year. The CPRHA Board reviews the right to review these declarations.


